Residential Recycling and Trash Collection Guide

Dear Billerica resident,

The 2010 Recycling and Trash Collection Guide includes current information about residential services provided by the town. It covers recycling, automated trash collection, yard waste, disposal of bulky waste, appliances and CRTs, and rules and regulations regarding construction and demolition debris (C&D) and Hazardous Household Waste.

Curbside Trash and Recycling Collection

Allied Waste picks up trash and recycling every Monday, except in holiday weeks when collection is on Tuesdays. See collection calendar for holiday schedule. If material is not placed at the curb on time or not prepared properly, the resident will need to hold onto the material until the following week.

Billerica Recycles Weekly

Recycling is mandatory in Billerica. In compliance with Massachusetts DEP waste bans, recyclable material must be separated from the trash. Material must be sorted and prepared correctly. Detailed instructions can be found in this guide. For general Recycling questions, please call Mary Delahanty, part-time Recycling Coordinator, at 978-671-1337.

Remember

Place recycling at the curbside separate from the trash,
if possible on opposite side of driveway or walkway.

Automated Trash Collection

Place **household trash** in the official Billerica trash cart. The cart lid must be closed. Household trash that does not fit in the cart with the lid closed must be placed in official overflow bags. Billerica overflow bags are sold at \$2/bag in packages of 5 bags for \$10 at O'Connor Hardware and all three Market Basket locations in Billerica.

Carts are identified by a serial number assigned to a specific address. If the resident moves, the trash cart stays at the home. Contact the DPW Admin office to request a cart for new home. Stolen carts must be reported to the Billerica Police Department. For an annual fee, residents may arrange for a second trash cart. Fee covers the period beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Annual disposal fee for additional cart is due June 15 for following year. Application forms are available at the DPW Admin office in Town Hall room G-11 and on-line at www.billericadpw.org. For additional information call 978-436-9178.

Remember: There is no limit to the amount of recycling that can be put out each week. Residents can save room in their trash cart by knowing what can be recycled. Material needs to be sorted correctly; non-recyclable items and contaminated material do not belong in the recycle bin: no Styrofoam, packing material, plastic bags or plastic wrap. See back page of this guide for more information.

Trash and recycling must be curbside before 7 AM (No earlier than 5 PM on the day before trash collection.) See collection calendar for holiday schedule. For missed trash or recycling contact Allied Waste at 1-800-442-9006 or the Town of Billerica at 978-436-9178 before 3 PM on the day following the scheduled collection. The cart must be accessible to the automated arm on the truck; allow 3' clearance between the cart and all obstacles including mailboxes, trees, parked cars, recycle bins and overflow trash bags. The opening on the trash cart should face the street.

The following items are banned from disposal with household trash: recyclable material, yard waste, construction debris, hazardous waste, propane tanks, fluorescent bulbs, TVs, White goods and similar items.

For **bulky items** too large to fit in the trash cart, residents must call Allied Waste in advance at 1-800-442-9006 to schedule a pick up. Items such as couches, chairs, tables, mattresses, box springs are considered bulky waste. Other items that do not fit in the trash cart may also be considered bulky waste. Allied Waste reserves the right to limit the amount and type of items picked up as bulky waste.

Recycling

The goal of any recycling program is to collect material that can be processed and remanufactured into new items. For example: clean paper and cardboard can be used to manufacture new paper and cardboard. Plastics are sorted and reused based on the type of plastic (#1-#7). Look for the recycle symbol to identify the plastic resin. Items made from mixed grades of plastic are not collected curbside. The recycling rules are intended to ensure that the material collected is of good enough quality to be marketable. For this reason all recyclable material must be free of food, grease and dirt. **Pizza boxes are not** accepted due to the likelihood of contamination.

Billerica's recycling is collected through a "**dual-stream**" system. The resident needs to sort material prior to placing it at the curb. Bottles and cans (plastic glass and metal) need to be separated from paper (magazines, catalogs, newspapers, junk mail etc) and cardboard. For additional information see the chart on the back page of this guide. If a household has a very small amount of recycling, a paper bag (not plastic) can be used to hold recyclable paper. The bag can be placed next to or on top of the recycle bin, otherwise residents should use two recycling containers. Large cardboard needs to be flattened, cut to smaller than 30" by 30" and tied or taped into bundles not more than 8 in. thick.

When recycling is collected, it goes into two separate compartments on the truck. Allied Waste is not expected to hand-sort mixed recycling; Allied Waste may leave the material on the curb if it has not been separated correctly, and resident will need to prepare it for collection the following week.

Residents may label and use an old trash barrel for recycling; combine bottles and cans(plastic, glass and metal). Free labels are available at Town Hall.

Appliance, CRT and Tire Collection Program (Not accepted with curbside trash collection)

Payment may be made by check or on-line with a credit card. PayPal account is not required. Pick-up date is scheduled after payment is received.

Fluorescent Bulbs - Mercury Recovery - Rechargeable Batteries

Items containing mercury require special handling in order to limit the risk of exposure. Thermometers, thermostats, mercury switches and button cell batteries can be dropped off at the Board of Health office in Town Hall.

Fluorescent bulbs including compact bulbs contain a small amount of mercury. Do not put them in the trash. They can be dropped off at O'Connor Hardware or at the DPW Admin office in Town Hall.

The following rechargeable batteries can be recycled: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium-Ion (Li-ion), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn) Bring them to the DPW Admin office or see www.call2recycle.org for other locations.

- *7 O'Connor Hardware and Taylor Rental accept large propane tanks. U-Haul accepts both large and small propane tanks. Fees Apply.

Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D)

Disposal of C & D from household building or renovation projects is the homeowner's responsibility. Debris includes treated and untreated wood, brick, concrete, asphalt and similar items. It is banned from disposal with regular trash. Resident must contact a licensed C&D disposal company. Consider donating reusable building material to a non-profit such Habitat for Humanity of Greater Lowell.

TRASH COLLECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

5.7.002 Municipal Solid Waste Disposal and Collection: Collection dates and routes will be determined by the Town of Billerica and may be subject to change pending contractual obligations or other circumstances.

(1) HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS: If a holiday falls on the scheduled collection day for a collection route, collection will commence on the following day.

(2) CURRENT ACCEPTABLE WASTES: Acceptable wastes shall mean all solid waste which can be placed into acceptable containers, excluding, inherently dangerous, toxic and hazardous wastes which shall from time to time be designated as "hazardous wastes" by State or Federal regulatory authorities having appropriate jurisdiction.

(3) CURRENT UNACCEPTABLE WASTES: As of the adoption of this regulation,

- (a) Construction and Demolition debris. (C&D)
- (b) Any of the following, in whole or in part: Auto hulks, engine blocks, transmission blocks, heavy machinery, skimobiles, motorcycles or tractors.
- (c) Stumps, regardless of size, and limbs or branches exceeding two and one half (2' / ~) inches in diameter or four (4) feet in length.
- (d) Pathological wastes.
- (e) Toxic and volatile chemicals, such as but not limited to: Oil based paint, paint thinner, paint remover, insecticides, herbicides, pool chemicals, household solvents, driveway sealers, hazardous craft supplies, wood strippers, or any other household chemicals.
- (f) Explosives.
- (g) Automobile batteries, tires, motor oil and antifreeze.
- (h) Florescent bulbs.
- (i) Propane gas tanks or other flammable materials.
- (j) Items not appearing as unacceptable waste may still be unacceptable. Residents are required to contact the Town of Billerica or its contractor for the proper determinations.

(4) CONTAINER: Household trash must be placed in an official Billerica Trash Cart. Use a regular trash bag for trash placed in the cart to prevent litter when the cart is emptied and to keep the cart clean. Trash that does not fit in the cart with the lid closed, must be placed in official overflow bags. Residents may arrange for a second trash cart. Contact DPW for information;fee applies.

(5) Trash and recycling shall be placed on the curbside no earlier than 5 pm on the day prior to collection and no later than 7 am on the day of collection. Collection shall not commence earlier than 7 am.

(6) Prior to collection it is the resident's responsibility to maintain safe and sanitary conditions at the curbside collection point and to otherwise comply with these regulations.

(7) Containers shall be removed within twelve (12) hours after daily collection and must be stored out of sight of public view in a secure location.

(8) BULKY WASTE COLLECTION: Residents must call Allied Waste by Friday to schedule pick up on the following Monday. Items such as sofas, chairs, tables, mattresses and box springs are considered bulky waste. Other items that do not fit in the trash cart may also be considered bulky waste. Allied Waste reserves the right to limit the amount and type of items picked up as bulky waste. Call Allied Waste at 1-800-442-9006.

(9) YARD WASTE: Leaves, grass clippings and small brush will be collected following yard waste schedule as determined by the Town of Billerica. Yard Waste is banned from disposal with household trash. Place yard waste in biodegradable bags or trash barrels clearly labeled for Yard Waste. Collection is on former trash schedule and is based on street address.

(10) APPLIANCES/WHITE GOODS: Items such as, but not limited to, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters, ovens, dishwashers, air conditioners, trash compactors, dehumidifiers, etc., are collected separately. Residents make payment and schedule pickup directly with Appliance Recyclers 1-877-228-2898.

(11) CATHODE RAY TUBES (CRT) ITEMS: Televisions, computer monitors, and other CRT items must be collected separately. Residents make payment and schedule pickup directly with Appliance Recyclers 1-877-228-2898.

(12) CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDING MATERIALS INCLUDING EARTH AND GRAVEL WILL NOT BE COLLECTED: Building contractors will be responsible for the proper disposal of all construction and building material or other debris resulting from work performed around residences. Residents performing home improvements are responsible for proper disposal of building materials. Residents cannot dispose of these materials with weekly curbside pick up.

Notice: These Rules and regulations are subject to change.
