Residential Recycling and Trash Collection Guide

The 2012 Recycling and Trash Collection Guide includes current information about residential services provided by the town. This Guide is also on-line at the DPW website: www.billericadpw.org. See the website for additional information and for current DPW announcements.

Curbside Trash and Recycling

Allied Waste picks up trash and recycling every Monday except in holiday weeks when collection is on Tuesdays. See enclosed calendar on Page 2 for holiday schedule.

Recycling is Mandatory: In compliance with Massachusetts DEP Waste Bans, Billerica residents are responsible for separating recyclable material from their trash.

ON TRASH DAY:

- Place Trash and recycling at the curb no later than 7:00 AM. Routes and schedules do change. Allied Waste will not go back if trash and recyclables are not out by 7:00 AM.
- Be sure Trash Cart lid is fully closed. This keeps animals, snow, and rain out, and prevents litter.
- Use Official Billerica Overflow Bags for any and all trash that does not fit in the cart with the lid closed. Billerica Overflow Bags are sold at O'Connor Hardware and Billerica Market Basket stores.
- If recycling is not sorted correctly, it may be left behind. Paper and cardboard pieces are collected separately from bottles and cans.
- DO NOT PUT PLASTIC BAGS, SHRINK WRAP, STYROFOAM or PIZZA BOXES in your recycling.
- Cut cardboard into pieces no larger than 30"X 30". Stack the pieces and tie or tape into bundles no more than 8" thick.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Do not overfill the trash cart.
- Do not place recyclables into plastic bags.
- It is your responsibility to know what items are collected in the curbside recycling. See page 8 for detailed instructions and if you have questions, please ask.
- Ordinary household rubbish is the only thing that should go in the trash cart. Examples of inappropriate materials include: recyclables, yard waste, construction debris, hazardous material, propane tanks, fluorescent bulbs, rechargeable batteries, tires or TVs. Allied Waste may refuse to collect the entire cart if it contains inappropriate material.
- **Bulk items:** Collection must be scheduled with Allied Waste. Call 1-800-442-9006 by 3:00 on Friday to schedule a **free collection** for the following Monday.
- **White goods, appliances, TV's, computer monitors, tires, and large metal items** are collected by Appliance Recyclers. See page 4 for fees and more information. Call 1-877-228-2898 or go to www.applrecyl.com to schedule a collection.

To report a missed pick up of Trash or Recycling please call: Allied Waste 1-800-442-9006 or Steve Robertson, Operations Supervisor, Billerica DPW at 978-436-9178. Please call by 3 pm on Tuesday to schedule a missed pick up on Wednesday. If material was not placed at the curb by 7 am, residents will need to hold onto the material until the following week.

Trash Collection

Household trash is only collected in official Billerica trash carts or official overflow bags. Billerica overflow bags are sold at O'Connor Hardware and Market Basket stores in Billerica. Regular trash bags should be used inside the trash cart to keep it clean. The cart lid must be closed. Residents may purchase official overflow bags for excess trash or may pay for the use of a second trash cart. Annual fee for the second cart covers July 1 – June 30.

Bulky items such as couches, chairs, tables, mattresses, box springs and other items **too large** to fit in the trash cart (but can be safely disposed of as trash) require a call to schedule a free pick up. Carpet needs to be cut into strips no wider than 4 feet then rolled and tied. Residents must call Allied Waste at 1-800-442-9006 by 3 pm on Friday to schedule a free pick up on the following Monday. Allied Waste reserves the right to limit the amount and type of items picked up as bulky waste.

Trash Carts are identified by a serial number assigned to a specific address. If the resident moves, the trash cart must stay at the address. Stolen carts must be reported to the Billerica Police Department. New owners are responsible for replacement cart fee if original cart is missing.

Contact the DPW Administration office Room G-11 to arrange for a second trash cart or to request a cart for new construction (for properties never receiving a cart). Application forms are available at the DPW Admin office in Town Hall room G-11 and on-line at www.billericadpw.org. For additional information call 978-436-9178.

Trash and recycling must be curbside by 7 AM (No earlier than 5 PM on the day before trash collection.) The cart must be accessible to the automated arm on the truck; allow adequate clearance between the cart and all obstacles including mailboxes, trees, parked cars etc. See collection calendar for holiday schedule. For missed trash or recycling contact Allied Waste at 1-800-442-9006 or the Town of Billerica at 978-436-9178 before 3 PM on the day following the scheduled collection.

The following items are banned from disposal with household trash: recyclable material (cardboard, paper, bottles, jars, cans etc.), yard waste, construction debris, hazardous material, appliances, TVs, computer monitors, fluorescents bulbs and items containing mercury.

Recycling

Billerica's recycling is collected weekly and processed through a “**dual-stream**” system. Material should be sorted prior to being placed at the curb. Bottles and cans (plastic glass and metal) must be separated from paper (magazines, catalogs, newspapers, junk mail etc) and cardboard. Allied Waste is not expected to hand-sort mixed recycling. If material is left behind because it was not prepared correctly, resident will need to prepare it for collection in the following week. There is no limit to the amount of recycling you can put out. Recycling conserves natural resources, saves energy, and helps reduce the cost of solid waste disposal for the town.

Recycle bins are sold at a cost of \$6/bin in the DPW Administration office, Room G-11 in Town Hall. You may also use trash barrels for recycling. Use one container for bottles & cans and a separate bin for paper and cardboard. Pick up a free Bottles and Cans label in Town Hall, Room G-11.

Fluorescent Bulbs - Mercury Recovery - Non-Alkaline Batteries

Items containing mercury require special handling in order to limit the risk of exposure. Thermometers, thermostats, mercury switches and button cell batteries can be dropped off at the Board of Health office in Town Hall.

Fluorescent bulbs including compact bulbs contain a small amount of mercury. Do not put them in the trash. They can be dropped off at O'Connor Hardware or at the DPW Administration office in Town Hall.

Bring small non-alkaline batteries to DPW Administration Room G-11 The following rechargeable batteries can be recycled at the DPW, Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium-Ion (Li-ion), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn) or see www.call2recycle.org for other drop-off locations.

- *6 Empty or dried out Latex Paint cans go in the trash. Special additive to dry out latex paint is sold at hardware stores.
- *7 O'Connor Hardware and Taylor Rental accept large propane tanks. U-Haul accepts both large and small propane tanks. Fees Apply.

Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D)

Disposal of C & D from household building or renovation projects is the homeowner's responsibility. C & D is banned from disposal with regular trash and includes treated and untreated wood, brick, concrete, asphalt, and similar items. Resident must contact a licensed C&D disposal company. See page 6 for suggestions or consider donating reusable building material to a non-profit such as Habitat for Humanity of Greater Lowell or Building Materials Resource Center in Boston.

Prescription Drug Take Back

Prescription drugs should not be placed into the trash or down the drain. Please watch for news about a prescription take back day in Billerica. Watch police website www.billericapolice.com for updates.

curb separated from the trash cart. Free labels are
available in Room G-11..

TRASH COLLECTION RULES AND REGULATIONS

5.7.002 Municipal Solid Waste Disposal and Collection: Collection dates and routes will be determined by the Town of Billerica and may be subject to change pending contractual obligations or other circumstances. To prevent missed pickup trash and recycling must be out by 7 am.

(1) HOLIDAY COLLECTIONS: If a holiday falls on the scheduled collection day for a collection route, collection will commence on the following day.

(2) CURRENT ACCEPTABLE WASTES: Acceptable wastes shall mean all solid waste which can be placed into acceptable containers, excluding, inherently dangerous, toxic and hazardous wastes which shall from time to time be designated as "hazardous wastes" by State or Federal regulatory authorities having appropriate jurisdiction.

(3) CURRENT UNACCEPTABLE WASTES: As of the adoption of this regulation,

- (a) Construction and Demolition debris. (C&D)
- (b) Any of the following, in whole or in part: Auto hulks, engine blocks, transmission blocks, heavy machinery, skimobiles, motorcycles or tractors.
- (c) Stumps, regardless of size, and limbs or branches exceeding two and one half (2'/-) inches in diameter or four (4) feet in length.
- (d) Pathological wastes.
- (e) Toxic and volatile chemicals, such as but not limited to: Oil based paint, paint thinner, paint remover, insecticides, herbicides, pool chemicals, household solvents, driveway sealers, hazardous craft supplies, wood strippers, or any other household chemicals.
- (f) Explosives.
- (g) Automobile batteries, tires, motor oil and antifreeze.
- (h) Rechargeable batteries, Non-alkaline batteries.
- (i) Fluorescent bulbs.
- (j) Propane gas tanks or other flammable materials.
- (k) Items not appearing as unacceptable waste may still be unacceptable. Residents are required to contact the Town of Billerica or its contractor for the proper determinations.

(4) CONTAINER: Household trash must be placed in an official Billerica Trash Cart. Use a regular trash bag for trash placed in the cart to prevent litter when the cart is emptied and to keep the cart clean. Trash that does not fit in the cart with the lid closed, must be placed in official overflow bags. Residents may arrange for a second trash cart. Contact DPW for information;fee applies.

(5) Trash and recycling shall be placed on the curbside no earlier than 5 pm on the day prior to collection and no later than 7 am on the day of collection. Collection shall not commence earlier than 7 am.

(6) Prior to collection it is the resident's responsibility to maintain safe and sanitary conditions at the curbside collection point and to otherwise comply with these regulations.

(7) Containers shall be removed within twelve (12) hours after daily collection and must be stored out of sight of public view in a secure location.

(8) BULKY WASTE COLLECTION: Residents must call Allied Waste by Friday to schedule pick up on the following Monday. Items such as sofas, chairs, tables, mattresses and box springs and carpeting are considered bulky waste. Other items that do not fit in the trash cart may also be considered bulky waste. Allied Waste reserves the right to limit the amount and type of items picked up as bulky waste. Call Allied Waste at 1-800-442-9006.

(9) YARD WASTE: Leaves, grass clippings and small brush will be collected following yard waste schedule as determined by the Town of Billerica. Yard Waste is banned from disposal with household trash. Place yard waste in biodegradable bags or trash barrels clearly labeled for Yard Waste. Collection is on former trash schedule and is based on street address.

(10) APPLIANCES/WHITE GOODS: Items such as, but not limited to, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters, ovens, dishwashers, air conditioners, trash compactors, dehumidifiers, etc., are collected separately. Residents make payment and schedule pickup directly with Appliance Recyclers 1-877-228-2898.

(11) CATHODE RAY TUBES (CRT) ITEMS: Televisions, computer monitors, and other CRT items must be collected separately. Residents make payment and schedule pickup directly with Appliance Recyclers 1-877-228-2898.

(12) CONSTRUCTION AND BUILDING MATERIALS INCLUDING EARTH AND GRAVEL WILL NOT BE COLLECTED: Building contractors will be responsible for the proper disposal of all construction and building material or other debris resulting from work performed around residences. Residents performing home improvements are responsible for proper disposal of building materials. Residents cannot dispose of these materials with weekly curbside pick up.
