Project: Demolition of Water Process Buildings

As part of the final work associated with the New Water Treatment Plant, the old water process buildings located at 250 Boston Road will be demolished. Testa Corporation of Wakefield, Mass. is the Contractor on the project.

Scheduled for demolition are the filter building, pretreatment building, carbon storage tank and building, fuel storage tank, and fluoride storage tank at the old water treatment plant site. The project also includes all related civil, electrical, and site work, refilling the remaining hole with structural fill, and the removal, transportation, and disposal of contaminated and non-contaminated materials from the site.

Before the winter of 2007/2008, the contractor had completed demolition of the pretreatment building, filter building, clearwell tank, and carbon storage tank and building, sorted and separated the demolition debris, filled the demolition site with structural fill, and placed loam over the area.

Testa Corporation has finished placing loam and will reseed the area this fall. Most recent work included the installation of a new electrical service and transformer for 250 Boston Road, which is occupied by the Recreation Department and the DPW Highway Division.

The project should be completed by Fall 2008, with a total cost of approximately \$575,000.
